Remembering Stephen

Rule #1 by Ed Gerson

One Friday night the guest speaker was a Rabbi Kahane. No, not THAT Rabbi Kahane, i.e., the JDL guy. Half of Morgantown showed up just in case. Our Kahane was a little rabbi from the old UAHC (now the URJ). He excitedly addressed us concerning small congregations' fund-raising. Very intense speaker, he'd jerk and scrunch in his shoulders, elbows and hands, repeatedly causing his yarmulka to pop off and roll down an arm where he'd catch it and place it back on his head while speaking. It never hit the ground.

The evening lengthened, the yarmulka trick never evolved. Stephen and Rita had been sitting in front of Donna and I. Stephen appeared to have had a very good, full, sociable dinner before services. Rabbi Kahane's talk finished, everyone stood up, and Stephen clearly remarked, "Well, if that was food for thought, I think we overindulged." There was stifled laughter and a few glares. It's been 20 years, and I still treasure that comedic timing.


He observed that when TOL was built in 1948 people didn't live much

past 65 so now those beautiful entry steps outside had become barriers. We needed American Disabilities Act compliance. As executor of his parents' estate he could release the Mabel DeVries and Louis F. Tanner Fund if congregants matched it dollar for dollar. The Building Fund would be the other one third funding. We needed an elevator, safety doors, fire alarms, new accessible restrooms and part of the basement floor had to be ripped out and replumbed. One year later, 1996, the project was complete. Instead of an over 65 person getting a lift, the first passenger was then 13-year-old Naomi Gingold, who had a dance class knee injury and was on crutches.

It was always fun talking to Stephen, as his humor was driven by keen intelligence and purpose. Here's a Stephen D. Tanner composite c.1995: he's wearing a yarmulke (that word again), it's inside out maybe for hygienic reasons, or maybe because it's Stephen. Attached to his right trousers pocket is a "Ross Perot for President" button. We strike up a conversation: "So Stephen, what's with all the kvetchers driving me nuts. It's the paint, the social hall, or it's the rabbi. They find fault with everything. The regulars. Even complete strangers." He says: "Little blue cards Ed. Carried a stack of them when I was

president. I listened, then handed anybody, member or non-member, those little blue cards and a pencil. Told them to write down their name and pledge to fund the changes." "Stephen, you were that blunt with strangers? Jewish tradition says treat the stranger kindly." "Get to know the stranger sooner Ed so they're not strangers anymore." "So Stephen, you've always been Re-

Stephen, you've always been Reform?" "Well you do know the difference don't you Ed? I mean between Reform and Orthodox? One of them can identify the shrimp fork."

When Judy and I arrived in town four decades ago, we were warmly welcomed by Stephen and Rita Turner. Their hospitality and caring quickly made us lasting members of the tree of Life "family." Stephen, of course, was never without conversation on any topic. I particularly remember in the early years talking outside the temple, taking a respite from a New Year service. He would always remark about the prayer book, "Too much repetition." His comment never

never changed over the several new editions and versions of the prayer book. Stephen is one-of-a-kind and truly missed by everyone he touched.

I remember Stephen Tanner for his many and diverse contributions to Morgantown and WVU, but wanted to mention his unique role in the genesis of the Pi Lambda Phi Jewish Lectureship series on campus. This series which has brought notable Jewish educators, artists, playwrights, media personalities and scientists to the campus has enriched us all. It was Stephen who had the temerity to demand that the national organization return unspent funds/dues/pledges to WVU when the fraternity was dissolved, and it was his persistence that persuaded the national administration to do so. This endowment began the lecture series, which has continued to this day. The academic community as well as the Jewish community of Morgantown has benefited from Stephen's and on their behalf, I wanted vision to acknowledge this often unheralded contribution

Stephen won a community award and was recognized in our Newsletter. After publication, I received an e-mail from Stephen thanking me for the recognition and gently pointing out that he spelled his name the "Jewish" way—with a "ph" in the middle, not a "v."

Startled I revisited the newsletter and discovered, to my surprise, Microsoft insists on converting Stephen to Steven. Stephen was greatly amused when I told him of my on-going "Stephen" battle with Microsoft Indeed, I must confess I only recently figured out the real fix.

Keep that in mind as you read these memories – just in case a stray "Steven" escaped my efforts to thwart the Microsoft demons.

Remembering Zelda

It was 1964. We had moved from New York/ Philadelphia to Morgantown, West Virginia (wherever that was). Attending our first Friday night service at the Tree of Life, we made our way down to the social hall for the Oneg Shabbat. At some point a discussion took place on some problem with many members voicing their opinions. One woman stood up and very quietly summed up the situation and offered what seemed to be an intelligent solution. I remember I turned to my husband and said "That is one smart woman." I later learned that this was Zelda Weiss and in the years that followed, working with her on many projects, I never found reason to change my first impression of her. Frances Ness
